- A-frame sign application. Size 21" x 41". This application applies to use beginning in September 2013.
- Doug presented a sign which has interchangeable letters with a white background. The board expressed concern that the name of the business did not appear on the sign. This particular sign looks like a reader board in the a-frame design. Doug asked if there was anything in the Code and Carol responded the Code only addresses a-frames and does not address a particular design; design is up to the Planning Board.
- Doug explained that the sign is not designed to have a name addition added to it.

MOTION: Patricia Dow made a motion to approve the sign with the condition that the name of the business will be added to the a-frame. The name of the business will appear above the framing of the sign at the top; i.e. the name of the business will be "fixed" on the sign and will be located above the framing and above the interchangeable lettering (white) portion of the sign.

SIGN APPLICATION #1331 - SPLIT DECK

- New retail shop (Split Deck) opening at 277 Canada St. (previously Alternative Silvermine).
- 6' X 4' wall sign is presented this evening.
- The board expressed concern that the sign presented will actually extend above the roof-line; the sign will not blend in with the building. Christina commented that the design – using playing cards as part of the design, requires a higher sign. There is very limited space on the building for a wall sign except for a long and narrow sign. The board discussed the possibilities for sign placement with the applicant.
- The board suggested having the card graphic in the center or on the side.
- The applicants left the meeting for a short time to measure the façade for the new size of the sign. Façade/shingled portion is 17 inches high. Where the number (277) appears is 10 inches and it sits 18 inches back. There are 3 ½ inches between the sign support/holder and roof.
- The board agreed the best alternative is to allow the sign above the roof otherwise it will be too close to the sidewalk and someone could hit it.
- The board agreed the sign can be 24 inches high and up to 10 feet long. The cards can be located on the side or in the middle. The board agreed the elements of the sign as they were presented in the 6' x 4' sign can be used in the new size, including the colors. If any of the elements or colors change the applicant will have to return to the Planning Board for approval.
- Two black gooseneck lights will be placed over the sign facing down.

MOTION: Patricia Dow made a motion approve the sign using the revised size of 2' high by up to 10' long. The sign will be placed on the shingled portion of the front of the building and will be centered over the door. The elements shown in the 6' x 4' sign as originally applied for are the elements (including the colors) that can be used in the 2' x 10' sign. These elements can be rearranged at the applicant's discretion. If any of the elements change including adding or eliminating a specific element, the applicant understands that she must return to the Planning Board at some later date for approval prior to installation of the sign. The sign can extend toward the number of the building; the number is positioned above the door. The sign cannot extend more than 3 inches toward the number above the door and no more than 4 inches above the roof line. Two black gooseneck lights will be installed at the back of the sign and will extend over the top of the sign.

He would like to see the code reflect that A-frame signs must have the business name permanently placed on the A-frame. He suggested eliminating the "easy-use" reader board style. This particular style does not have much style and sort of distracts from A-frames that have been designed with more detail. If a business wanted to use a reader board as something they could change periodically the sign ordinance could reflect that only caulk boards (with some design – like the winery has done) would be allowed.
